The Art, Science and Practice of Mediation have developed dramatically since the first of these Seminars and, in addition, mediation is becoming more ingrained in the British way of life, whether in the commercial sector or otherwise (including the family, neighbourhood, community and other specialisms). Mediation is growing outside the UK with the UK taking a lead on spreading the message around Europe and elsewhere.

The London Branch is very pleased indeed to announce a panel of very distinguished and highly experienced speakers for this Seminar:

- ◆ Sir Anthony Colman, former (as he will then be) Judge of the Commercial Court, whose landmark judgment in *C&W v IBM* constituted a significant development in the law surrounding mediation and whose 1996-drafted Commercial Court ADR Order continues in use to this day
- ◆ Jane Andrewartha has for the last 27 years been a partner in Clyde and Co, specialising in heavyweight multi-party international litigation and arbitration cases both in this country and worldwide. For the last decade she has also been widely respected as one of London's most effective mediators dealing with cases across a variety of sectors.
- ◆ David Cornes, former Senior Partner in Winward Fearon (Solicitors), is now a busy full-time independent commercial mediator; he is in Legal 500's top 10 UK mediators and mediates disputes in a wide range of fields, including construction, property, business (partnerships and family companies), commercial contracts and professional negligence.

Hew R Dundas is the current President of the CI Arb and Vice-Chairman of the London Branch; he is also Director of Scottish Mediation Network Ltd, the umbrella body covering all types of mediation in Scotland, and is an occasional mediator including pro bono mediations in the Edinburgh Sheriff Court.

Sir Anthony Colman will address mediation issues as seen from the Bench with particular focus on the relationship/interface between arbitration and mediation; Jane Andrewartha will address the subject of Mediation Mythology tackling, from a mediator's perspective, the question of what really happens within the process and David Cornes will address, inter alia, the way that the Courts have impacted on commercial mediation.

A historical note: this is the 4<sup>th</sup> such Seminar kindly hosted by Clyde & Co; however, there was no intention to commence a series but in 2004 the then Mr Justice Colman agreed to speak on Case Management in Arbitration but tore up his notes and delivered a wonderful commentary on the UNCITRAL Model Law of Conciliation which was so well-received that London Branch did a follow-up in 2005 and so on. Following the Seminar, which will conclude around 8pm, Clyde & Co will generously host a reception for the speakers and all attendees.
